From the many thousands of matches that have been played this year and from the numerous teams selected throughout the province we have had minimal complaints. To the less than 1% of you that felt justified to register complaints, I personally thank you. Without complaints or issues to deal with, organizations can become complacent. It is good when we are challenged and hopefully we reach fair decisions. On behalf of the NLVA, our staff and executive I wish you all the best at this AGM and have a safe trip home.

Eric welcomed all members. Eric noted that this is the first time that the AGM has been held on the west coast in a while and suggested that our Hall of Fame festivities would validate this decision. Eric stated that the overage issue would be dealt with and asked that the issue be moved to motions/resolutions to avoid repetition in the discussions. The agenda was reviewed. **Motion:** Mosher/Murrin -"that the Agenda be approved" - **Carried.** 

## **Reading of the Minutes:**

Motion: Mosher/Catlin "That the minutes be accepted as presented" - Carried

## **NLVA 2010-2011 Review**

Eric asked that Russ present a review.

#### **NLVA Review:**

- Russ reviewed the numbers and growth that occurred on Page 13 of the AGM booklet.
- Sr. Tournament- If it gets much senior bigger we will have to look at options for venues/location/cap for number of teams. Concerns with the status of the venues as some are below standard for the current level of senior play.
- Russ noted that, for a variety of reasons, coaching clinics were down this year.
- Russ noted that the webpage was used extensively for communication.
- Brad Pitcher has coordinated the Mini Volley program. MAX as part of their sponsorship leaves 6 balls per Mini Volley camp with hosting schools/clubs.
- MAX surge program was presented by Russ who noted that this will be used by NLVA teams and be available for clubs next year for a fee.

# **NLVOA Chair Report (Cindy Hiscock)**

Cindy highlighted the following.

- New substitution rule being implemented in the Fall. Cindy will be looking to circulate a video that depicts the procedural changes around the handling of substitutions to teams prior to competition in the fall.
- Thanked ROC executive as well as Finton, Randy and Dave Jewer for assigning various tournaments throughout the season.

# **Elite Development (Russ Jackson on behalf of Deon Goulding)**

- Russ noted that the 14U dev program model is being implemented. No travel off the island, just a camp experience with sessions in St. John's.
- Move towards more of an elite model. Evaluations were more focused for each athlete and done only by the coach on their court. Elite team coaches were given full control over floor time.
- We had a large number of coaches express interest in the program this year. Thanks to all coaches who helped out.
- Coaching positions for the summer programs have been advertised. Russ encouraged everyone interested to apply.

- Sunday April 15 set as regional tryout date for next year. June 2 will be provincial camp. June 15 will be the payment deadline.
- There is a huge amount work being done to support this program and Russ thanked all who volunteered.
- Luke Harris and Megan Conroy have been announced as Canada Games coaches for the next cycle.
- LTAD model and implications for the NLVA were discussed.

# 4 Year Plan

- Russ presented the plan as outlined on pages 26-28 in the AGM booklet.
- Big initiative is the purchase of sport courts. Looking at the purchase of 6 courts with 3 being housed on the west coast and 3 on the east. It would follow the VC model for competition. Again, this is in the proposal stages.

## **Audit:**

- The Audit was reviewed as outlined in the AGM booklet.
- Russ noted that registrations were up and sponsor donations line has increased.
- Scholarship Fund paid out all funds this year.
- Last year of a Canada Games cycle, hence a large amount indicated in this line.
- Costs of the Provincial Summer Program have increased and the executive may have to consider an increase in the registration.
- Motion: Jewer/Wareham that the audit be accepted as presented. Carried.

## Fair Play

The proposal for the 2010-11 season was discussed to seek feedback. Logistically the "old way" was better for scheduling (1. Fair play will be for the 13u, 14u and 15u events only. In 14u and 15u there will be Tier 1 - non-fair play; Tier 2 - fair play. Both will tier out also)

Eric commended Russ and the entire staff for their work this year. Eric announced that Russ has been retained for the next 3 years. Eric thanked the executive for their work and singled out Finton for his work with the Hall of Fame and his commitment to chair this committee.

# VC Update (Eric Hiscock/Russ Jackson)

- Eric stated that the VC AGM is next week both Eric and Finton will attend.
- Russ discussed various issues concerning Volleyball Canada.
- Volleyball Canada's NRS is still a contentious issue for the NLVA.

## **New Business**

 Nathan Wareham discussed the Jeff Gallant memorial proposal. This was referred to executive for action

# **Motions and Resolutions Motion: Mosher/Conroy**

"Whereas club teams that wish to go to Eastern National Tournaments are unable to play together unless they are from the same regions even though teams do use players out of region. Be it resolved that the NLVA put in place a completely separate club championship for teams planning on attending Eastern National Championships." – carried.

# **Motion: Conroy/Oates**

"Whereas athletes attend the same schools cannot necessarily play at NLVA provincials due to existing regional boundaries, be it resolved that the NLVA regional boundaries revert to the original NLVA regional boundaries for NLVA club Provincials as opposed to NL Games boundaries" – **referred to executive.** 

## **Motion: Butt/Dolomount**

"Whereas the NLVA piloted a non-fair play division in 14u and 15u for the 2010-11 year, be it resolved that we revert to fair play for all at the 14U and 15U divisions." – **carried.** 

Motion: Manning/Hiscock

"Be it resolved that the NLVA permit overage players to play with their peers at NLVA age championships provided they are not repeaters. These overage players may play 3 years with Junior High teams once they reach grade 7 and 3 years of Senior High once they reach grade 10. These overage athletes must be informed that they are not eligible for provincial teams playing at national events unless it is at their own appropriate age level." — withdrawn

## **Motion: Oates/Conroy**

"Be it resolved that the NLVA adopt age based tournaments with accommodations for grade considerations given legitimate medical/inclusion rationale, be it further resolved that children play 3 years in Jr. High and 3 years in S. High and are aware that they cannot attend and National Championships." - carried

## 2011-2012 Sea~Hawks Report

## \*Winners of the 2012 Sea~Hawks Cup for Volunteer Work

#### **Co-Ed League**

Last Spring the Sea~Hawks put forth a Spring Co-Ed League. The NLVA does not currently offer any Co-Ed events. The Sea~Hawks approached the NLVA and offered to create and manage a 10 week Co-ed League. This league was huge hit with 22 teams registered and they cannot wait for the league to start up again next year. This League has provided the Sea~Hawks with a chance to gain some experience with setting up and running these types of events. Our team leaders were responsible for collecting registration, organizing officials, setting up the gym each week. The coaching staff set up the league, however the athletes did an amazing job with being responsible and giving the league its great reputation.

## Adopt~A~Hawk

In its second year the Adopt ~ A ~ Hawks was a tremendous success. The Adopt-A-Sea~Hawk program is a free program to schools/teams that currently have a parent/guardian/ or teacher, etc. who do not have an extensive knowledge of volleyball, but wish to learn and keep athletes involved in the sport. The Men's Volleyball team will provide 2-3 athletes per team to come and teach the athletes and team administrators the sport of volleyball. If the team wishes to participate in Leagues, tournaments, etc. the adopted players will assist in every way possible.

This year we reached out to 6 teams and reached a total of 78 athletes who would otherwise would not have been able to participate in a volleyball program this year.

#### **Blood Donor Clinics**

Our partnership with Blood Donor Services has grown over the past number of years. This year we pledged 75 donations, and have already surpassed out goal Each blood clinic held in the university, our team would attend, help promote the mandate of Blood Services, the MVB Program, and Blood awareness. The team members also had an event at Blood Services where they cooked breakfast for everyone donating blood on the morning of Nov 12<sup>th</sup>.

This far exceeded the expectations of everyone involved and was a great community experience.

#### **After School League**

For the second year the MVB Sea~Hawks have been responsible for officiating the ASL. Each Monday from 3-6pm our team officiated the matches as a way to promote volleyball at the Varsity Level.

## **Sea Hawk Recruitment Camp**

22 athletes from Canada were recruited at National Championships in Ontario.

## **VolleyCentral**

14 players and coaches travelled to VolleyCentral. We volunteered out time to officiate the ENTIRE tournament, as well and convene each venue. This tournament could not have been run if we had not volunteered. There are not enough officials in the gander area to run this 50-team event. Deon Goulding and Russ Jackson have been extremely grateful that we helped get this tournament off the ground in its inaugural year. We departed St John's and travelled to Gander on Friday November, and returned on Sunday afternoon.

#### **CIS Interlock @ the MUN Field House**

This was Cara's first trip on the National scene and she ended up as 1<sup>st</sup> official in a 15U female gold medal match as well as a line judge during a featured gold medal match. Quite an honor for a first timer! She also attended a women's symposium during the tournament.

I traveled to Guelph, Ontario in February to participate in a National Evaluators clinic. The invitation was quite an honor since only National/International officials are extended this privilege. Besides the theory side of the clinic, we had to conduct evaluations on a National candidate and National official at both a CIS men's and women's match. It was quite an eye opener to evaluate officials of this caliber. Words cannot describe how much I learned during this experience.

# **Referee's Development:**

One of my commitments as ROC was to ensure our officials development across the province. This past year, our executive conducted evaluations on numerous referees once again. Due to varying circumstances, I was unable to get to the West Coast to conduct evaluations as I had hoped. This is definitely something we need to focus on next year.

Another goal will be to work on our regional/national promotions. On the Regional side, both Cara Courtney and Brad McCarthy were successful and are now promoted to Level III officials.

As we all know, there have been a number of rule changes the past decade. We will be brining in a mandatory 'refresher' exam for all officials to ensure that each official is familiar with both the new and the old rules. We will also be hosting a few 'refresher' clinics for those unsuccessful in the exam or for those interested in attending. These exams will be introduced on the National scene in a few years so we are attempting to take the proactive stance.

## Junior Summer Elite Program

This year was the inaugural year for the Junior Elite Program for 14 U athletes. This program was led by Melissa Oates. This program had approximately 80 athletes (male and female) and comprised of sessions in Mental Training, Physical Fitness, and On-court training for 1 week in July. This program was a huge success and there are 143 athletes registered for the program this summer.

#### Canada Games 2013

The Canada Games Programs are well under way following a very transparent process.

On the female side, Megan Conroy is the Head Coach, Nathan Wareham the Assistant Coach, and Terry Mosher the Manager. The Road to the Canada games began for the female athletes in November with open try-outs taking place in St. John's, Clarenville, Bishop's Falls, and Corner Brook. From these try-outs, 38 athletes were selected and attended a Christmas camp from Dec.  $28^{th} - 30^{th}$ . After this camp, the number of athletes was narrowed down 29 for another camp that was held during April  $9^{th} - 13^{th}$ . Upon the completion of this camp, the roster was narrowed again to 24 athletes who will now train as 2 squads travelling to the NTCC competition in Winnipeg and compete at the Eastern Elites in Halifax during the month of July.

On the male side, Luke Harris is the Head Coach, Chad Richards the Assistant Coach, and Brad Pitcher the Manager. The selection process for the male team follows a different route compared to the female team due to the age category difference, with an open try-out taking place in December of 2012. For athletes in the 18U category, the process as already begun with these athletes being considered in the Canada Games Identification Pool. The 18U Provincial Team will travel to Gatineau for NTCC competition before attending the Eastern Elites in Halifax during the month of July.

Finton Gaudette will be coaching the male side of the Canada Games Beach Program and Jessica Crocker will be coaching the female Beach Team. The selection process is well under-way with no teams announced to date.

#### Eastern Elite Championships

We will be hosting the 2013 Eastern Elite Championships. Planning is underway.

#### Coaching Education

At the regional team camp all coaches were led by Karen Murphy, Chad Richards and Luke Harris is developing their own practices plans during the Team NL selection weekend. The mentor coaches focused on drill selection, drill transitions and overall practice quality.

## Mini Volleyball

The NLVA initiated a grassroots project to revive mini-volleyball throughout the province. In the month of January, the NLVA brought coaches from all over the province to St. John's for the weekend to train them in mini-volleyball. From there, these coaches are expected to assist develop a mini-volleyball program in their area. The NLVA will supply equipment and resources to this program.

## 2011-2012 Mini Volleyball Report- Brad Pitcher

On May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2011 the NLVA re launched it's Mini Volleyball Program. The goal of this program is to run clinics in as many elementary schools as possible. At the end of the 2010-2011 school year the NLVA was able to run clinics in 9 schools in the St. John's area.

Throughout the summer of 2011 the NLVA ran clinics within the Mount Pearl Day Camp System. These clinics allowed the NLVA to introduce the Mini Volleyball Program to approximately 100 children in the appropriate demographic.

Upon the commence of the 2011-2012 school year the NLVA sent a coordinator province wide to complete Mini Volleyball Clinics. During this time the NLVA was able to run clinics in another 31 schools province wide.

On January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2012 the NLVA took a huge stride within the development of its Mini Volleyball Program by hosting a Mini Volleyball LTAD Project. This seminar brought together 42 volleyball coaches, mentors and volunteers province wide to certified them as Mini Volleyball Facilitators. After this seminar the NLVA's goal was to have these facilitators run a similar clinic in their regions for high school athletes. After the completion of these clinics the high school athletes along with the facilitators would run after school and intramural Mini Volleyball programs in their local elementary schools. The athletes would be compensated by the NLVA for their instruction hours.

To due there are over 25 elementary schools that are running Mini Volleyball Programs because of this LTAD Project.

Along with compensating the instructors the NLVA has also been donating equipment to schools that have participated in Mini Volleyball Clinics. In the past year the NLVA has donated approximately 275 volleyballs to elementary schools.

In February, the NLVA received a great opportunity to teach Mini Volleyball to aspiring Physical Education teachers at Memorial University. Brad Pitcher and Luke Harris ran a daylong clinic at Memorial during a court sport course. There were approximately 50 students who are completing a physical education degree that took part in this Mini Volleyball session.

The NLVA was also able to bring Mini Volleyball Clinics outside of the school atmosphere. We were able to run clinics with a Sparks Group and have scheduled sessions within the Torbay summer camp systems.

In the past year approximately 3500 students, and 130 teachers and volunteers have been introduced to Mini Volleyball within Newfoundland.

In the fall of 2012 the NLVA hopes to continue to complete Mini Volleyball Clinics in the province's elementary schools and also, continue to have high school students run after school sessions.
