We had a very successful year with clinics so first of all congratulations to all successful candidates. Once again, we did not need to recruit referees as our executive was actually approached to host each clinic. We held level 1 clinics in Lewisporte, Grand Falls-Winsor, and three clinics in St. John's. We held level 2 clinics in St. John's and Clarenville as well as promoting some referees to Level 2 in Central. Thanks to Deanne Dietz, Markus Hicks, Noel Lilly, and Dave Jewer for helping conduct the clinics. Finally, we held a much needed Level 3 Clinic in St. John's with 5 candidates. I am happy to announce that I have forwarded Markus Hicks' name to Volleyball Canada for promotion to Level 3. Congratulations!!! We will continue to work with the others throughout next season so they can be successful in the promotion.

#### Officials Travel:

Unfortunately we did not have any one travel this year but were lucky enough to have Derek Brooks and Neil Deveau from Nova Scotia participate in our Volleyfest Championships in October. Neil worked with a couple of our future Level 3 and Level 4 candidates. Thanks Neil! They enjoyed working with Neil

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and learned a lot from him. A special shout out to Derek for working with a couple of our newer Level 2 referees. He helped them every step of the way and both have improved tremendously. Thanks!

#### Referee's Development:

This year was extremely successful for the Central Region as Dave Jewer hosted 2 clinics in much needed areas. Stephanie Smith continued to work with the new level 1 referees in Clarenville and we were successful in promoting 6 of them to Level 2. Once again, I spent a lot of time evaluating all levels of referees this year. The consistency level has improved throughout the province but I will strive to make this even better in the future.

We were fortunate to have Guy Bradbury travel to our 18U Male Championship in March to conduct evaluations on some of our promising referees. This must have been extremely challenging for Guy as he is used to conducting evaluations on Level 4 and 5 referees instead of Level 1's and 2's. Kudos!! He conducted a pre-tournament meeting on both days of the Championship. Once again, this helped in all aspects of our referees. Although we cannot do this at every tournament, this is something that I would like to conduct as much as possible in the future.

Next year, we will rotate clinics back to the West Coast and Clarenville for Level 1 clinics and host the Level 2 clinic in Corner Brook and St. John's. We will also be hosting a Beach Referee Clinic this July. Looking forward to having Omid come to the Rock and teach us about the sport!

This July, we will be extremely busy as we are hosting the Eastern Elite Championships. We will be working very closely on our referee development during this tournament.

# 2015-2016 Technical Director Report

The past year has been another year of successes, and building to progress forward.

Our Team NL programs were successful with multiple medals, and some very outstanding performances at the Eastern Elites, our Jr. Elite programs were as successful as usual, thanks to the direction of Mellissa Oates and Chad Richards. The CAD chair will elaborate on the specific numbers and results.

The Coaching Community Program (CCP) has entered its 2<sup>nd</sup> year, and was even more successful then last year. More of the provinces newer coaches were in attendance to learn, ask questions, and share thoughts. Through attendee's of the CCP a network of coaches has been started with an email list that coaches can connect with others coaching in the same age/gender category. Again this year, the central installment was very disappointing with regards to numbers. The discussion and conversation was high quality, however in order make this stop more viable, coaches in the central region will have to pre-register, so we have some indication on how many attendees we will have (A minimum of 5 is required).

Coaching Clinics: There has been much confusion and debate on the coaching situation in Canada this past year. You will be pleased to know that our province is ahead of the national average with regards to progress into the new system. We will be offering an Advanced Development workshop as soon as possible. If enough coaches are available, we will attempt to run a session in late June. If you are unable to attend, there will be another workshop in early September.

We currently are only in the process of training one course facilitator. For anyone who wishes to get more information on how to become a facilitator, please contact me.

Team NL 2016 has been off to a great start so far. With our Canada Games programs in full swing, we did see a slight drop in the number of participants at our ID camps.

In working with the CAD committee, we were able to develop a new program entitled <a href="The Provincial Training Excellence Program">This</a> program is designed to service the athletes who require additional skill training, but may not benefit from the exposure to competition. This allows our Eastern Elite Championship teams, to be purely focused on team play, and coaches will be able to focus less on skill work. This also means that we effectively double our athlete pool. No longer will athletes leave the Selection Weekend with a confusing list of comments, they are placed in one of the two programs and every athlete that is identified as having the potential to make our provincial team, is given the chance to hone their skills, and become a better athlete.

The Team NL Selection weekend was another great weekend. Special thanks to Nate Wareham, and Brian Bennett, who planned, ran sessions, as well as placed athletes into programs. Dave Preston, was our guest coach, and did a phenomenal job. He was a great source of information to all our coaches, many of which had the chance to sit with Dave, one on one, and get to ask as many questions as they could come up with.

We are all looking forward to this summers programs, especially the new PTE.

# Coach and Athlete Development Report

The 2015 - 2016 marked another wonderful season for the NLVA and the Coach and Athlete Development Committee. On behalf of the Coach and Athlete Development Committee I would like to extend a huge appreciation and thank you to all of our volunteer coaches who assisted in making all of our programs possible. Without your dedication and commitment these programs would not be able to take place.

#### Provincial Program

- The **Team NL ID Weekend** had a great turn-out for athletes again this year. The Team NL ID Weekend witnessed athletes with an improved skill set, and a very talented athlete group. We are certainly seeing the benefits from the **Junior Elite Programs** for the 14U/13U age groups. The numbers for the 17u category were down slightly due to the Canada Games Pool athletes being exempted from the tryout process. From this session, identified athletes were invited to attend the Team NL Selection Weekend in St. John's to vie for a spot in the NLVA Provincial Program. New this year was the implementation of the Provincial Training Excellence Program which is an extension of our Provincial Team Program. This program will see athletes get Provincial Team Training without the competition component of the Eastern Elite Championships. This year, the **Provincial Training Excellence** Program will be convened by John Slauenwhite (Memorial University Female Volleyball Head Coach). Athletes who were unsuccessful in making the Eastern Elite Championships Program were automatically selected to attend this program.
- The Junior Elite Program had another strong showing again this past year, seeing increased numbers in participating athletes. The Junior Elite Program was divided into two divisions - 14U Male/13U Female

and 14U Female; taking place on two different weeks. The 14U Male/13U Female Junior Elite Program was convened by Chad Richards while the 14U Female Program was convened by Mellissa Oates. These two programs had approximately 180 participants (male and female) and comprised of sessions in Mental Training, Physical Fitness, and On-court training for 1 weekend (Friday - Sunday) in July. This program was a huge success and there are 180 athletes registered for the program this summer.

- The Eastern Elite Championship was hosted in Halifax, Nova Scotia. The NLVA Provincial Program competed at a high level during this competition and had a strong showing at the tournament. A huge thank you to all of our volunteer coaches, and staff, for making the Eastern Elite Championship a success!
- The Eastern Elite Championships are scheduled for St. John's on July
   29 July 30.
- There are another 8 teams selected this year and any interested coaches for this year's summer program should apply online.

## **Coaching Community Seminar**

 Seminars throughout the province. These seminars were very successful

The following is a status report in point forms for our Male Indoor CG program. The following is what we have already completed since previous AGM:

- July '15: Evaluation of athletes and introduction to staff at EEC
- Aug/Sept '15: Held open tryouts to our High Performance Training Pool in Corner Brook, Gander, Clarenville and St. John's in conjunction with the female training group
- Nov '15: Held first HP training group camp in St. John's
- Dec '15: Held second camp in Gander
- Mar '16: Held third camp in St. John's that culminated in two competitive matches against the Memorial Seahawks
