We pay \$1000 per year to Mun for scholarships, whereas we always paid \$2000 when the men's program was in place.

Overview

The 2019 – 2020 NLVA Volleyball Season was big success for High Performance volleyball programing with 3 Eastern Elite Gold Medals and 1 Bronze out of the 4 divisions. The programs offered through the Association have grown and we have implemented changes to influence culture, accountability, integrity and of course; coach and athlete development. The expansion of the Canada Cup and Team Atlantic programing has been expanded, and will serve as a new pathway for Atlantic Region Athletes and Coaches to Expand and grow. We have a very strong working group and look forward to the challenges and growth that lie ahead in 2020-2021; as we learn to adjust to a new normal post Covid-19.

Junior Elite

• The Junior Elite program has now developed into a program all of its own with Stewart Macpherson as its implementer. Having a fulltime staff member run this program as a part of their portfolio is exciting and speaks to the impact this program has and how it has grown and expanded since its inception. Last year 148 male and female athletes participated in the Junior Elite program, which normally runs in early July. The program is currently postponed due to Covid-19.

Provincial Program

- This year the 2020 Team NL ID Weekend Postponed Due to COVID-19
- The committee will work with Luke and staff do determine alternate programing once start-up begins
 - 1. **2019 Eastern Elite Champions (EEC).** Athletes that were placed into this program needed competition to assist in furthering their volleyball skills and making them better athletes. The **Eastern Elite Championships** were held in **Halifax, NS** in **July 2018** that saw over 400 athletes, 1500 spectators, 70 coaches, 20 officials, and 6 convenors attend the event. Below is a list of Teams that participated in the Tournament last summer along with their placing.

2. There unfortunately were issues with 2 athletes, and issues with two coaches. These issues are under review and will need to be discussed with the executive at some point. We have many volunteers who help make this program run, however with the new coaching education, getting experienced coaches to run these teams still remains inconsistent.

No more clinics will be scheduled in small communities until 8 participants are pre-registered. 3 weekends were lost due to requested clinics not having enough interest in their area.
- Adv. Dev. Online course has concluded and was very successful. Luke will offer more online options in the future, with a 1 day in person portion. There will also be a Development coach workshop offered online soon.

<u>Canada Cup</u>

- Team Atlantic Team Atlantic was a huge success this past year. On the male side Ryan Littlejohn represented NL on the squad and on the female side, NL was represented by Alyssa Warford, Brianna Chaulk, and Nathan Wareham.
- NL sent one 16u female team to the Canada Cup in Halifax. This program is currently under review due to some issues that arose. This program is looking to expand and will have a male component in 2021.
- The Canada Cup was an excellent event despite the heat wave that caused havoc at the Dalplex and Halifax area.
- Luke did a great job with Dan Ota as a part of mentorship. And as last year, was able to ensure there was independent observation along with the NB Rep.
