NLVA 2019-2020 Review (Russ Jackson)

Russ welcomed everyone to this year's AGM.

This has been a trying year for us, so we have been moving very cautiously to avoid any Covid outbreaks.

There has been a lot of stress on all of us this year, so I must thank the Executive members for their support for meeting very quickly at time to make decisions on some of our event. also, we met several times for me to give a report on what is happening all across Canada.

We are working on a plan to have gyms open on the weekends, but this all depends on Covid cases in the province.

There will not be any Provincial age school tournaments allowed anytime soon because of the direction of Public Health.

From my recent discussions with sport NL and provincial government there will not be any tournaments in the near future, June would probably be the earliest at this point.

We are developing a plan to get Athletics back in the gym on weekends, so we are developing a plan for return to play.

Finances right now are ok, but we are we are working on a 3-month goal plan to keep all staff on for the full year.

The Federal Government Emergency Load plan for businesses in late May is something that we took advantage of so we get \$40,000.00 and will have to pay back \$30,000.00 sometime in the near future.

#### Coach and Athlete Development Committee Report 2020-2021

As many are aware the Covid-19 pandemic cancelled our previous summer's provincial programs in 2020. However, despite the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, the NLVA was still able to offer multiple programs throughout the 2020-21 year for both our athletes and coaches. For athletes this included a new year round Provincial Excellence Training program, our traditional Team NL EEC and PTE ID camps, a Canada Games Next Generation program, as well as a variety of other youth programs/camps. For coaches, we were able to offer both clinics and info sessions through online sessions.

#### **Next Generation Program**

This year we rebranded the Jr. Elite program as the Next Gen Program in recognition of the 2025 Canada Games being hosted in Newfoundland by St. John's and the surrounding municipalities. For the first time the program was run on a number of weekends throughout the year. This was to start trying to reach out to a younger generation of potential athletes at an earlier age in a year where many would not have access to any sort of volleyball training. The Next Gen Program that ran through the year has had 123 athletes over its program weekends and was lead by NLVA staff member Stewart Macpherson.

There will be Next Gen camps offered in the summer at both Corner Brook and St. John's locations. From these camps, 2-3 all-star teams for both male and female will be selected to participate in our EEC summer training.

#### **Provincial Programs**

#### <u>Provincial Excellence Training Program</u>

In the fall of 2020, the NLVA ran two ID tryout camps for the Provincial Excellence Training program. Athletes from these two tryouts were selected to teams that would plan to train one weekend a month starting in January 2021 to simulate a year round provincial team program that would eventually carry over to the EEC program. The number of teams selected were:

- 3 18u teams (2 female, 1 male)
- 3 16u teams (2 female, 1 male)

#### • 1 15u team (female)

Due to increased Covid-19 measures, camps in February and March had to be cancelled. During this time the NLVA alongside Premier Athletic Therapy offered a 10 week Online Provincial Team program for the athletes in this program. These online sessions focussed on strength & conditioning, nutrition, and mental training. Recently, the training weekend in June has also been cancelled due to Covid-19 outbreaks.

The Provincial Excellence Training has been very successful. Ideally we would be able to offer a similar program in a non-pandemic year. The commitment from the coaches has been fantastic.

#### EEC and PTE

The NLVA ran ID camps for the EEC and PTE programs during weekends in May of 2021 at both a Corner Brook and St. John's location. Athletes from these ID camps were either selected to a team as part of the EEC program or they were selected to the PTE program. The number of teams selected for EEC were:

- 2 17u teams (1 female, 1 male)
- 2 16u teams (2 female)
- 4 15u teams (3 female, 1 male)

There were 74 athletes selected to the PTE program.

#### Program Numbers for 2020/21

- Provincial Excellence Training ID Camps (Fall 2020) 188
- Team NL ID Camps (May 2021) 196
- Provincial Excellence Training 89
- Team NL EEC Selections 96
- Team NL PTE Selections 74

Note that the 89 selected to the Provincial Excellence Training who began training in January were not permitted to attend the May Team NL ID camps, the 196 were all new players. The registration is still open for EEC and PTE, the numbers above only reflect the numbers selected.

#### **Upcoming Summer Programming**

- Next Generation (St. John's & Corner Brook July 4-5-6-7-8-9)
- Team NL PTE (NL Sports Centre July 12-13-14-15-16)
- Team NL EEC (NL Sports Centre July 23-24-25-26-27-28-29-30)

With the Covid-19 pandemic there are no plans to have teams travel outside the province to participate in competitions (traditionally the Eastern Elites and Canada Cup). However, during the EEC training week, teams will train/practice and during the last two days compete in an interprovincial team tournament for the NLVA Provincial Team Cup. The teams for the EEC week will

include those originally selected for EEC, the Provincial Excellence Training teams, a male and female team selected from the PTE week and 2-3 male and female all-star teams selected from the Next Generation camp. The current plan is to have a unique tournament structure implemented to have teams only play other teams of about equal skill level. This would be teams playing teams within their own age group or one group above/below of similar skill. An example could be a high ranked 15u team play a lower ranked 16u team. A point system will be use to have eventually have one NLVA Provincial Team Cup Champion. We are excited to see how this new tournament structure plays out. We are still in need for coaches for our summer programming.

#### **Coaching Development**

This past year we managed to offer two coaching clinics. Volleyball Canada gave us approval to modify the existing in person course to go online accompanied with a 1 day in person when required. Luke ran an Advanced Development Coach and a Development Coach clinic, the in person for the Development was scheduled for early June but was cancelled due to Covid-19 outbreaks. Volleyball Canada has now made the Development Coach course online. Luke has completed the training and can deliver this online.

Luke has also been running weekly online coaching sessions. Each session would typically see anywhere from 15-30 coaches with about 8-15 being regulars. Topics can be discussions about coaching theory, pertinent issues (safe sport, coaching in a pandemic), and technical and tactical issues. They also have planned practices, evaluated drills and allowed coaches to ask questions and critique the plans.

A big thanks to Luke for all he has done to progress the development of our coaches during this pandemic. He has been getting a lot of positive feedback on both the courses and sessions.

#### **Canada Games**

In the fall of 2020 it was announced that due to the Covid-19 pandemic the 2021 Niagara Canada Games would be postponed until August of 2022.

The indoor Canada Games coaching staffs experienced some changes over the past year. Nathan Wareham (Male Head Coach), Morgan Mitchell (Female Assistant Coach), Peter Butt (Male Team Manager) and Mellissa Oates (Female Team Manager) all resigned due to personal reasons but have all indicated they will still be involved with NL volleyball going forward. The CADC thanks each of them for their time in their positions. Some of these positions have since been filled. Richard Christopher is the new male head coach, Richard was previously in the assistant coach role. Filling Richards's previous position for assistant coach is John Slauenwhite. Both team manager roles and female assistant coach are still vacant but hope to be filled before their open tryout scheduled August 13-15. Finton Gaudette and Katie Gaudette are still coaching our beach teams.

All our Canada Games programs have been progressing through the pandemic, for more details on each program please see their respective reports.

#### **Closing Remarks**

After being appointed the CAD Chair position for the past 10 months I can get a better appreciation for how much work goes into the development of our athletes and coaches. I am especially thankful for all the work our CAD committee members do. They all provide valuable input and support; they are in deed truly passionate about our athlete and coach development. Thank you to all our coaches who give their time to our programming and those invested in taking courses and seeking certification. A big thank you to Finton and his crew for the ongoing development in our beach volleyball program. Thanks to the NLVA staff for providing detailed Return to Play guidelines to public health that allowed us back on the court as quick as possible. I look forward to our summer programs as well as the upcoming 2021-22 season.

#### Canada Games Beach 2022 (Male & Female)

As you can imagine, it has been a very weird Canada Games quad! Beach Volleyball in this province has enough challenges as it is with the lack of proper training facilities, short playing season and the high cost of travel for competition. BOOM! Then Covid -19 hit.

#### Summer of 2020

During the summer of 2020 we managed to host one training camp and introduced the game to several indoor players. It was a successful camp, but the average age was very low.

#### Men (4 Athletes)

On the Men's side, we had two athletes training in New Brunswick with their university squads. They did not take part in any matches, but they got the required physical and mental training and a tonne of touches. These touches are directly transferable to the beach game. The other two athletes are also doing quite well as they will be playing senior men's ball this fall in leagues. The coaching staff were very excited to see how the male side showed up in great physical condition. It was quite obvious that they have either been training using the sport specific beach program or their university programs.

#### Women (10 Athletes)

We had 10 show up at camp in the female pool. There was one university athlete who contacted us about the pool. She later sent an email saying she was no longer interested; that was disappointing. We also tried recruiting some other athletes who we knew could easily make the transition to the beach game. That did not happen either. We had two university aged athletes attend the camp. These athletes have been playing/training regularly with the Corner Brook Beach Volleyball Association. It showed as their beach volleyball IQ and their physicality were much higher than the rest of the pool. Both athletes remained in Corner Brook for the fall and train with Grenfell Campus Varsity Team. One MUN athlete returned to the MUN team after Christmas. The rest of the pool were quite enthusiastic, but young. We were very impressed on how the younger athletes were following their training programs. We keep receiving training updates from them. Some have gotten trainers to help them with their beach specific programs.

#### Summer of 2021

We have submitted our Team Selection Criteria to Sport NL

The Canada Games Selection Process will include the three assigned competition dates above.

Teams will compete for points over a three-weekend series, with the team accumulating the most points in the series, being awarded the Team NL rep for the 2022 Canada Summer Games.

- 1. July 2-4 Corner Brook Open Camp Team Training
- 2. July 16-18 Corner Brook Training & Competition
- 3. August 6-8 Corner Brook Training & Competition
- **4.** August 20-22 Corner Brook Training & Competition

It was debated on whether to try to find the best athletes in our pools and hope they would gel, or to train teams and let them compete for their spot. I spoke with colleagues across the country, along with James Sneddon when he visited St. Johns a couple of summers ago. Almost all agree to let athletes find the right partner and play it out. Selecting athletes can cause numerous issues if the athletes are not compatible. This can magnify team issues as we move closer to the Canada Games.

Our dates do pose problems for some younger athletes with provincial team camps and also for some athletes returning to university on the mainland. It is unfortunate, but coaching staff holidays had to be taken into consideration as well. We stayed away from the last weekend in August for that purpose.

We decided that we needed to name our Canada Games athletes by the end of this summer because we wanted to hit the ground running at the end of April of 2022 and possibly during the Easter week of 2022. Obviously, training at this time would mean out of province travel and we hope national, and possibly even international travel restrictions will allow.

At least three of the Canada Games pool athletes have been hired under our grants. Three will be working for the Corner Brook Beach Volleyball Association. This will allow flexibility in training schedule for these athletes. If they worked elsewhere, there could be work scheduling conflicts. I am not sure if others in the pool will be employed under the NLVA grants as well.

We have advertised our summer schedule and have picked up a couple of new athletes already. Registration for our July 2-4 camp will be up shortly and we will then have a better idea of interest and commitment at the beach level for summer of 2021.

The coaching staff are anxiously awaiting word from Volleyball Canada on the Beach Performance Coaching Program. There has been no communication for months on this.

As Team NL Beach, we feel that we are in a good spot. Generally the rest of Canada has a head start on us, but with the pandemic, most of the country has not been training, playing or travelling for competition. For once, we feel we are all starting off on an equal playing court.

Canada Games Beach Coaches (Male and Female)

#### **Canada Games Indoor Male 2022**

Since January 2021 we have established our Canada Games Male Training Pool. We currently have 23 athletes who have trained together for multiple weekends throughout the year. Our coaching staff for these sessions has included myself (Richard Christopher), John Slauenwhite, Jesenta Lilly, and Alex Ings. This group of athletes are very motivated and we currently have athletes included in the training pool from the St. John's, Avalon, Eastern, Central, and Western Regions. Throughout these sessions, we have focused on technical, tactical, and mental skills. Athletes record their RPE's after each training session to ensure safety and we have introduced team journaling for athletes to reflect on current training sessions and set goals for future sessions. We have a very enthusiastic and motivated group. We, as coaches, are looking forward to our next training camp in July. Our official Canada Games tryout is scheduled for August 13<sup>th</sup>/14<sup>th</sup>/15<sup>th</sup> at the Provincial Training Center in St. John's. We are working with the NLVA to promote our tryout with hopes to provide an opportunity to all eligible athletes from all areas of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Over the last year, it was a priority for our coaches to complete all of the required NCCP courses offered by SportNL. To further our coaches' education, when on court training sessions stopped due to the pandemic, our coaching staff completed over 60 NCCP coaching credits, all required courses, as well as optional courses such as nutrition, physical literacy, sport medicine/science between us. These courses provided opportunities to collaborate with leaders from other sports' areas and universities. We are now applying information learned to both our season and practice plans.

We look forward to working and collaborating with the NL male volleyball athletes, NLVA, and Newfoundland and Labrador Canada Games Committee for a great 2021-2022 season.

#### **Canada Games Indoor Female 2022**

Like many volleyball programs, the past year has been restricted for the Canada Games Indoor Female Team program due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic caused many key events in our plans to be cancelled or postponed. Included in this was the actual Niagara 2021 Canada Games itself, in September of 2020 it was announced the Niagara 2021 Canada Games was postponed until August 2022. This postponement required the Canada Games Council alongside our NSO to determine the new eligibility age for the athletes. In November of 2020 it was decided that eligibility age for indoor volleyball would not change and remain at athletes born in 2003 and later.

In the fall of 2020, the NLVA ran provincial team tryouts for a year-round provincial team program and allowed for the age groups to include Canada Games eligible athletes (born in 2003 and later). Two 18u teams were selected by the Canada Games Head Coach with the intention to train one weekend a month starting in January 2021. The Canada Games coaching staff would be highly involved in coaching these two teams.

A Canada Games Training Pool was planned to be formed in April 2021 by considering those athletes from the two 18u provincial teams as well as athletes selected in Team NL open tryouts scheduled for March 2021. However, COVID-19 restrictions were once again placed in NL and these tryouts had to be postponed to May 2021. Due to this postponement, it was decided that athletes from the two 18u provincial teams would form the base of the Canada Games Training Pool with the Head Coach also inviting athletes outside these two teams. Additionally, the Head Coach was leading the May Team NL tryouts wherein athletes could also be added to the pool from these tryouts.

The current Canada Games Training Pool (26 athletes) has had training weekends in April and May with another scheduled in mid-June. The pool will also be participating in the NLVA's 2021 Provincial Eastern Elite Championship Program from July 23-30 which is based on a week of training as well as tournament during the final two days.

There is an open tryout scheduled in St. John's from August 13-15 of 2021 for any athlete interested in being selected to the 2022 Canada Games Female Indoor team. This tryout will form a new Canada Games Training Pool that will train/compete until the final team selection in the spring of 2022.

Unfortunately during the past year the team's assistant coach and team manager had to leave the team for personal reasons. I would like to thank both Morgan and Mellissa for their work during their time with our program. The positions are currently vacant but are planned to be filled during the summer of 2021 before the open tryout.
